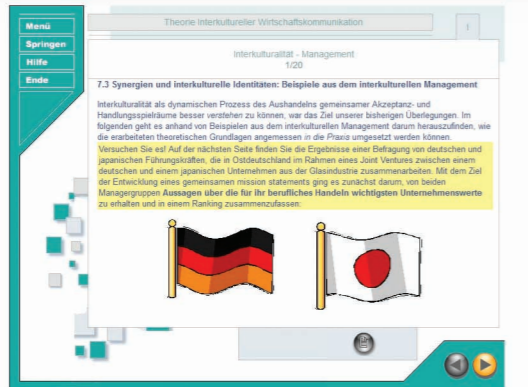

The Internet –based Simulation Game

“InterCulture 2.0”



Just like “social networking,” Web 2.0 enables cooperation regardless of location and time zone. This joint activity, this communication [communicare = to do something as a group] is at the same time a condition not only for choosing a topic, but indeed, for the creation of “interculturality.”

The Learning Concept: four teams of 3-4 trainee participants each, interact as simulated companies, synchronously at four locations anywhere in the world. These four companies are connected via virtual classrooms and a learning platform. Their cooperation is governed by conditions of intercultural teamwork, such as different time zones, multiple languages, cultural differences, etc. Their interactions are recorded on-screen, for later analysis in virtual plenary sessions together with the local trainers.

- *Live interaction using virtual classrooms, whiteboard, document sharing and chat*
- *Team work via Learning platform*
